DUE DILIGENCE PROCESSES FOR SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

As part of our initiative to identify and mitigate risk we have considered the nature of our supply chain in order to identify risks and have asked members of that supply chain to make a commitment to us that anti-slavery measures are in place within their respective organisations and that each will comply with our own policy.

We have in place systems to:

- Identify and assess potential risk areas in our supply chains.
- Mitigate the risk of slavery and human trafficking occurring in our supply chains.
- Monitor potential risk areas in our supply chains.
- Protect whistle blowers.

SUPPLIER ADHERENCE TO OUR VALUES AND ETHICS

We have zero tolerance to slavery and human trafficking. To ensure that our supply chain and contractors comply with our ethics we have in place a supply chain compliance programme. This consists of checks at pre-qualification stage of the measures that organisations have in place to combat modern slavery. In order to become an approved supplier to our business, a supplier must demonstrate and commit to a zero-tolerance approach to modern slavery.

We have a compliance team, which consists of involvement from the following departments:

- Legal
- Procurement
- The Board of Directors

At JCA we have standard requirements which must be incorporated into our contracts with our supply chain, obliging suppliers to comply with our Anti-Slavery Policy.

AWARENESS

We expect all of our own staff to uphold our legal and ethical obligations. Our Anti-Slavery Policy was publicised internally when first issued and is made available to all new staff upon joining the business.



FURTHER STEPS

Following a review of the effectiveness of the steps we have taken to ensure that there is no slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains we intend to carry out an audit of our processes and procedures to ensure that all practical steps are being taken to combat slavery and human trafficking.

This statement applies to all applicable companies in the JCA group (meaning companies with JCA Head Co Limited as parent company), including JCA HQ Group Holdings Limited and JCA Engineering Limited.

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes our Group's 2017 slavery and human trafficking statement. It was approved by the Board on 20 June 2017.
